## INTERNATIONAL STUDENT CHECKLIST

Who is an International student: Any student who requires a Study Permit.

## **STUDY PERMIT:**

The following need to be supplied before the school is able to submit a letter requesting a Study Permit.

R5000, 00 - Building Development Fund per family (once-off) Non- Refundable R5000, 00 - Language Development Fund per Learner

Registration Fee: R1000.00 (non-refundable)

The full year's school fees for current year (the upfront discount applies)

Contract for each year with the obligation to pay the applicable fee for each consecutive year R2000.00, (non-refundable).

In the event of a student leaving P.C.S before the end of the phase to attend another S.A. school, the student's Guardian/Parent and school are obliged to inform Home Affairs.

The school will supply International students with an Acceptance Letter and attached letter for Home Affairs for the Study permit. A Copy of the Study Permit is required for the file within 3 months of the date of the Acceptance Letter. Failure to comply with this will result in the student losing their space and the contract between the school and student becoming nul and void.

## **OTHER DOCUMENTS:**

Legal proof of Guardianship.

A signed letter from both parents (where applicable) stating that care and responsibility is handed over to said Guardian.

## **EXEMPTION FROM AFRIKAANS – IMMIGRANT STATUS**

The school will make an application on behalf of the pupil for exemption from Afrikaans provided the following requirements are met:

- Proof of schools attended
- Copy of Study Permit and/or Passport and Permanent Residence, whichever is applicable.

Immigrant Status is granted to a pupil under the following conditions:

- a) A child or a dependent of a Diplomatic representative of a foreign government accredited in South Africa; or
- b) A person who:
  - 1) First enrolled at and entered a South African school in Grade 7 or a more senior grade, or
  - 2) Having begun his or her schooling at a school in South Africa, has attended school outside South Africa for two or more consecutive years after Grade 3 or its equivalent, and has subsequently returned to South Africa.
